Project Updates:

Veterans: In March of this year, Mary's Missions provided 6 "Kitchen Kits" for veterans transitioning to independent living. The kits were packed in a 70 qt. tote and included everything for the kitchen from place setting to baking dishes to pizza pan.

Also, for veterans, The Milo C. Huempfner Health Care Center has requested beds and bedding for homeless veterans transitioning to independent living. While Greater Green Bay Community Fund was unable to finance the project, Mary's Missions plans to provide bed frame, mattress, and bedding, with the first set going out October 1. Then, as needed and funds permit. If you wish to provide a bed set for a veteran, the cost is \$525.

Homeless – Mary's Missions prepared and delivered 60 Summer Snack Bags for the Homeless. These included tuna and chicken salad kits, saltine crackers, spray cheese, Squeegie applesauce, sun screen, packages of peanuts, bottled water, rain poncho, and 2 \$5 gift cards to McDonald's. If you might be interested in providing these snack bags, they each cost \$29.

We are now gearing up for the Winter Backpack Project. 24 backpacks have been received and many items have been donated to fill these backpacks. The packs will include winter hat, scarf, mittens, socks, rain poncho, notebook and pens, soap, shampoo, deodorant, comb, towel and washcloth, toothbrush and paste, hand sanitizer, wet wipes, and NEW this year, 2 \$5 gift cards for McDonald's. If you would like to furnish a backpack for this project, they cost \$47 each.

The donor remarked, "It opened my eyes to a cultural group that is easy to overlook but such a rewarding group to help." What a great concept.
